Our History

Fort Collins Children's Theatre (FCCT) was founded in 1958 by a group of civicminded women who felt that children should be exposed to live theatre. FCCT has continued, thrived and grown since that time, claiming the distinction of being the longest continually operating arts organization in Fort Collins. FCCT was the very first group to stage a production in the brand new Lincoln Center in the fall of 1978. Throughout the continued FCCT has commitment of providing live theatre opportunities as an enriching experience for children of all ages and owes its success to strong community support.

Our Programs

Our Fall Family Musical: in the Lincoln Center Performance Hall, our fully staged musical production combines the talents of experienced adults and talented youth to bring classic stories to life on the stage. We provide a special performance for local school students and our generous sponsors allow us to bring these productions to families at an affordable price, an important part of our mission.

Summer Theatre: FCCT offers "Center Stage Summer Theatre" for two groups of kids; Center Stage Juniors for kids ages 10-14 and Center Stage Seniors for kids ages 12-17. Both workshops allow young actors to learn about all aspects of musical theatre; acting, dancing, singing, and technical aspects. Each workshop is held half days for three weeks in length, culminating in weekend performances at the Lincoln Center Magnolia Theatre, Traditionally, this has been the first 3 weeks in June, however, we are in the process of adding a second opportunity to be part of a three week production in July. Stay tuned to our Website for details!

Story Theatre: This is a one week program for kids ages 8-12, as a fun introduction to theatre. Kids learn a role to dramatize a short story with a performance on the last day. Traditionally, this has been the third week in June, but watch for more opportunities to be added!

Places Everyone!: Our teen performers, ages 13-20 made their debut in March 2025 in the production, "Be More Chill" at Bas Bleu Theatre to sold out houses! This is an exciting, inclusive and welcoming new theatre group that is now gearing up for a Magnolia Theatre Performance of "The Prom" at the end of February! Watch for details about auditions and rehearsals coming soon!

FCCT+: This is our exciting new expansion of theatrical opportunities! We now have a rehearsal, build and workshop space at 2016 E. Lincoln, a supplement to our shared Vine workspace. Here we can more easily accommodate more classes, workshops and productions for kids and adults in our ever expanding community of creatives! Check our website often to learn more!

Outreach: Part of our mission is to bring live theatre to more kids and venues in anyway we can. One example is our spring drama class in collaboration with Adaptive Recreation Opportunities. Come see us perform at the Senior Center, details will be on our website!







Kate Austin-Gröen (Director) is a director, producer, intimacy director, and actor with over 35 years of experience in theatre arts. Kate is happy to be directing her second show with Fort Collins Children's Theatre (her first was Elf in 2022). Kate also serves as Resident Intimacy Director and Associate Producing Artistic Director for OpenStage Theatre & Company, where her directing credits include The Full Monty, Treasure Island, and Tiny Beautiful Things. She is the creator of the Observation and Re-Creation (OaR) acting technique, which empowers performers to convey authentic emotion through physicality while maintaining emotional well-being.

Jen Bray (assistant director) is thrilled to return to the Fort Collins Children's Theatre as Assistant Director. A longtime Northern Colorado theatre artist, she has performed and worked behind the scenes with companies including OpenStage Theatre, Bas Bleu, Encore! Encore!, and Loveland Community Theatre. Jen holds a B.A. in Performing Arts with an emphasis in Acting/Directing from Iowa State University and is very excited to share this experience with her partner, Brian Bernethy, who is performing in the pit orchestra - marking their first production together in five years.

Karen Christophersen (Production Manager/School Show Coordinator) is a retired teacher, and now channels her creative energy into theatre with and for kids; as coordinator for Story Theatre and Center Stage Summer Workshops. He was a board member and Technical Director for the Fort Collins Mural Project, as well as serving as a board member for "Launch: Community Through Skateboarding."

Marissa Dienstag (Co-Choreographer) is over the rainbow to be part of this amazing team. Prior to moving to Colorado she assistant directed, stage managed, choreographed and acted in numerous productions in various Ohio community theater companies. She is also involved with OpenStage and is excited to be part of her third FCCT production. Anna Epstein (Tech Director/Stage Manager) is a single mom, artist, and entrepreneur. Anna has over 26 years in the live entertainment industry, working almost every aspect in the world of rock n roll, weddings, special events and theater! Stacy Montes (Co-Choreographer) has devoted over 31 years to teaching dance in Fort Collins, Colorado. She has taught students ranging from ages 3 to adults, covering a wide array of dance styles. As a founding member of High Performance Dance Theatre in Fort Collins, Ms. Montes actively engages in both choreography and performance. Her contributions extend to various community initiatives, including the New Visions Dance Festival, the Choreographers Showcase, and musical theatre productions at Bill Reed and Erwin Middle Schools in Loveland. Additionally, she has choreographed several productions with the Fort Collins Children's Theatre as well as performed in Willy Wonka and The Wizard of Oz in past years. Motivated by her passion for teaching, children, and dance, Stacy has opened Dancing Blooms Studios.

Jessica Pluta (FCCT Operations Manager) has jumped into theater management with both feet (arms, legs and brain) after joining the FCCT board of directors. She can turn cardboard into castles, hot glue into magic, and duct tape into dreams. Without her, the witches would be riding on kids' plush-horse riding sticks, cows and houses would be grounded, and the Tin Man would just be a guy holding a funnel (OK – her husband made his axe – but she painted it!). Her magic-wand touch is on full display so that you can sit back, dream, and remember that "some people without brains do an awful lot of talking, don't they?"

Victoria Villalobos (Makeup and Hair Designer) has loved theatre since she was a child and is thrilled to be part of Fort Collins Children's Theatre's production of The Wizard of Oz! She has worked with FCCT on the past eight productions, most recently as the Makeup Designer and Stylist for The SpongeBob Musical. Victoria has also collaborated with OpenStage Theatre & Company, earning two Henry Award nominations for Outstanding Sound Design for The Book of Will (2024) and The 39 Steps (2025), as well as with Opera Fort Collins, Canyon Concert Ballet, and The Cheyenne Little Theatre Players. She wishes to thank her family and friends for all their love and support!

Victor Walters (Co-Music Director) has performed as a collaborative/rehearsal pianist, keyboardist, and music director all over the Northern Colorado Region. Until last fall, he was the resident musical director for CSU theatre department. This spring he music directed CU Boulder's production of The Big Fish, and was pleased to be able to perform with the cast for the composer, Andrew Lippa. Currently, he is the resident Music director for the University of Northern Colorado's School of Theatre Arts and Dance. In addition to FCCT, he has worked with The Little Theatre of the Rockies, OpenStage Theatre, Opera Fort Collins, Greeley Stampede Troupe, The Loveland Orchestra, The Chevenne Symphony Orchestra, The Greeley Philharmonic Orchestra, Midtown Arts Center, The Theatre Company of Lafayette, Jesters Dinner Theatre, Candlelight Dinner Playhouse, and countless high school productions in the Northern Colorado area. Victor made his Carnegie Hall Debut with the choir students of Fossil for the Choirs of America Conference in New York City in 2022. In 2023 and 2024 Victor was nominated on BroadwayWorld.com for Best Music Director and Performance of an Orchestra. Victor's production credits are too numerous to list here, but for pretty much any musical you can think of, he has done it! He couldn't be more proud of the work of this amazing cast of FCCT's production of The Wizard of Oz!

Rory Willats (Projections designer) is a projection designer and theatermaker who joined the theatre faculty at CSU this year. His projection work has been seen in theaters and galleries around the US and UK.
